

Happy 150th Anniversary Disciples Women!



Disciples Women's Ministries (also known as CWF or Christian Women's Fellowship) is a general ministry of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada. Its beginnings can be traced back to October 21, 1874, when Caroline Neville Pearre organized a group of women that came to be known as the Christian Women's Board of Missions. This group, which was organized and managed exclusively by women, was organized for the purpose of addressing the lack of local and international mission work by the Church. In February 1876, just a short two years after organizing, the first mission trip to Jamaica took place, where they were tasked with resurrecting the ministry previously led by the American Christian Missionary Society. In addition to mission work, the CWBM provided training and programs, which equipped thousands of young people, and established four Bible Chairs at state universities.

Since then, Disciples Women have continued to organize in innumerable ways and advocate for serving the needs of God's people across time, culture, and geography. Other groups and many phenomenal women help make up the Disciples Women's fabric through their much-needed work that's left an indelible impact on general church ministry and the world.

In 1949, Christian Women's Fellowship (CWF) was formed by 75 women at Turkey Run, Indiana, to unify all the different women's groups.

The Christian Women's Fellowship is open to all women of the church and we invite all to participate. We meet on the first Tuesday of each month at 10:00 in the church office. Following our meeting, we go out for lunch together and enjoy great food and fellowship.

This is a wonderful and active ministry in our church and one that will bless you greatly. Come and be a part of our group!!



Arlen Notes



Merry Christmas or Happy Holidays by Rachel Held Evans

There is a pernicious rumor that resurfaces every Advent season and spreads across social media faster than a cold in a kindergarten class. It is the rumor that God can be "kept out" of Christmas. You may have heard it from Kirk Cameron or an anchor at Fox News, or an army of culture warriors who have once again worked themselves into a frenzy over the "War on Christmas." Galvanized by fear, they storm checkout counters to demand that clerks issue them a "Merry Christmas" instead of "Happy Holidays" and cry persecution when inflatable manger scenes are moved from public courthouses to private property. They pine after the good-old-days when Christians could force Jewish kids to sing Christmas carols at school and they demand that every gift purchased, every mall opened late, every credit card maxed out must be done so in Jesus' name or else Christ will be "kept out" of Christmas.

They do it because someone told them that God needs a nod from the Empire to show up, forgetting somehow that the story of Advent is the story of how God showed up as a Jew in the Roman Empire. In a barn. As an oppressed minority. To the applause of a few poor shepherds.

The whole story of Advent is the story of how God cannot be kept out. God is present. God is with us. God shows up-not with a parade but with the whimper of a baby, not among the powerful but among the marginalized, not to the demanding but to the humble. From Advent to Easter, the story of Jesus should teach us that God does not need a mention in our pledge or on our money or over the loudspeaker at the mall to be present, and when we fight like spoiled children to "keep" God in those things, we are fighting for idols. We are chasing wind.

Religious persecution is real. Suffering is real. But sharing the public square is not persecution and being wished "happy holidays" causes no one to suffer. We would do well this time of year to remember the words of the Apostle Paul from Philippians 2:

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but to each of you to the interests of others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death-even death on a cross!


